JOB DESCRIPTION

The Cardiovascular Perfusionist provides treatment and extracorporeal support for adult and pediatric cardiac surgical patients. As a member of the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute team, the primary role of the perfusionist is to operate the heartlung machine for cardiopulmonary bypass. Working closely alongside the surgeon and anesthesiologist, perfusionists are responsible for managing intraoperative blood gases and electrolytes, administering drugs and blood products, and monitoring patient hemodynamics.
