PERFUSIONIST

OPPORTUNITIES IN SASKATCHEWAN

The Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) has opportunities for Perfusionists in Saskatchewan. Below is information about what the SHA can offer you:

PAY, INCENTIVES, AND BENEFITS:

- Wages: \$50.83 /hr \$62.01/hr (5 step range)
- Recruitment incentive of \$100,000 for a 5 year return for service agreement \$50,000 upon signing, \$25,000 in years 4 and 5
- Relocation assistance provided in the form of reimbursement of eligible expenses
- Standby rates of pay Present standby pay is \$7.50/hr
 - In addition, the SHA will compensate Perfusionists annually as follows: Upon completion of 1800 standby hours, Perfusionists will receive a lump sum payment of \$10,000; Upon completion of a further 500 hours (2300 hours total), Perfusionists will receive an additional lump sum payment of \$10,000; Upon completion of a further 500 hours (2800 hours total), Perfusionists will receive another additional lump sum payment of \$10,000
- Vacation: Accrued at a starting rate of 3 weeks vacation per year
 - Vacation accrual rate may be adjusted based on an assessment of acceptable experience and/or verification of accrual rate from a previous employer
- Sick Leave:
 - New employees are credited with an advance of five (5) days [40 (forty) hours] of sick leave credits, and full time employees will thereafter accrue sick leave credits at a rate of 1.5 days per month worked, up to a max of 190 days
 - Pending verification of unused sick leave credits from a previous employer, new hires can transfer unused sick leave credits up
 to a maximum of thirty (30) days [two hundred and forty hours (240) hours], if they obtain employment with SHA within 90 days
 of terminating from said previous employer
- Earned Days Off (EDO): 1 unpaid day of rest every three weeks
- 13 statutory holidays per year
- Defined-benefit Pension Plan, Employee & Family Assistance Program, and Extended Health and Dental Plan
- Referral bonus of \$5,000 for any Perfusionist who refers another Perfusionist to the SHA conditions apply
